# **Evangelism: Sharing our Passion for Christ Across the GTA**

In February, members of First United Pentecostal Church and A New Beginning Apostolic Church gathered for a weekend of training with Pastor Mark Shutes. His passion to reach the world for Jesus was inspiring.

We believe that God has not forgotten about the City of Toronto and He is mobilizing the Church to reach our communities in a strategic way. Consequently, for the next three months some 70 church members will undertake intensive training to reach our neighbourhoods.











## **The Nehemiah Project**

### Jesus' Storehouse

The "Nehemiah Project" is based on the premise of groups of people (families) coming together to rebuild ruined places. To assist us in this goal the First United Pentecostal Church under the leadership of Pastor T. Pickard gave us the use of a warehouse and donated many goods to be distributed to those in need. As we began to organize, we realized that we needed shelving, transportation bins, boxes, labels and other supplies.

After praying for these items God miraculously gave us 16 free transportation bins from Windfall, free unlimited boxes and 5000 labels all in time for us to complete the work. The entire church (from toddlers to seniors) volunteered their time over several evenings to prepare the storehouse for the mission.

Phase 1 is now complete. Phase 2 will involve transferring our overflow goods from a second room to Jesus' Storehouse. Stay tuned...

### An Opening in the Wall

As mentioned above, we needed industrial shelving and this is the story of how God answered our prayer. The Lord sent His Word to build our faith. He reminded us of an event in the Bible. Jesus asked His disciples to bring him a colt and He instructed them to tell the owners that the Master had need of it. This scripture caused us to believe that we would be given free shelving to meet our need.

In no time, a church member noticed hundreds of industrial metal shelves strewn on the floor at one of his construction sites. It was the identical shelving we needed. He remembered the scripture about the colt and he believed that this was the shelving we would be given. He made several requests for a donation of the shelves but was refused.

After about three weeks, the Project Manager and the foreman were in a bitter disagreement. As a result of this conflict our church member was instructed by his foreman to close all the walls, leaving no opening. This was a vindictive act that would have caused many problems and cost thousands of dollars. Our church member found a way to resolve the crisis by creating an opening in the wall. The Plant Manager, on behalf of the owner, was so thankful for this act of kindness that he gave us all the shelves we needed free of charge, and even used his forklift to load everything on our truck.
